BRIEF DETAILS OF WORK ACCOMPLISHED IN THE YEAR 2017.

In the year 2017, SKY Nepal completed 7 years of amazing social works with support and trust from our founding family members Mr. Howard Fallon, Mr. Boris Shekhets and Mrs. Misa Hayashi along with many friends, family, organizations and donors from all over the world. SKY is grateful to all of you.

We started a new IMMEDIATE RELIEF AND HELP programs on the occasion of the 7TH ANNIVERSARY OF SKY. We accomplished many touching and humane work in and out of Kathmandu valley.

1: The last monsoon created a huge loss of lives and property in the southern part of Nepal. We first distributed Food grains to the Matatirtha Old age Home (old & physically disabled women).

2: We got in touch with a small orphanage of 17 boys and girls (People Welfare Social Center) in Kathmandu where we celebrated birthday of our daughter Irina Shekhets on 24th August and distributed school bags, clothes, stationeries and food grains. We had bags and education kits from Erin Murphy and Dylan Porter teachers of a school from California.

3: We celebrated the birthday of our daughter Kendra on 27th August at EPSA Nepal and distributed bags, stationery and food grains to 18 children of the physically disabled and single mother. We also distributed yearly scholarships to the most poor and physically disabled 7 girls. The scholarships were provided by my friend Mr. Rinzi Pasang Lama (USA).

4: The flash flood in the far west Kailaii took the life of a young boy 14 years old. We immediately sent Rs. 19,000 to the grandfather for the necessary funeral and home expenses. Another boy of 12 years died in a river flooding near Hetauda and the grandparents were given Rs. 10,000.

5: Families of 7 were swept away by the flash flood in the remote village of Makawanpur. Our man Prem Gole and team rushed to the village to help retrieve the bodies and help the villagers for the funeral. We sent Rs. 10,000. I saw the place and met a relative of the family on 9th December who request for more help.

6: Two families in the surrounding villages were immediately provided with Rs. 10,000 each for their necessary relief due to the death of the father and a mother of another family. When we initiated this small work, more people joined and helped.

7: A family in the Terai -Siraha had their home totally destroyed along with their property. The daughter Kiran Chaudhary is living at EPSA and we sent Rs, 40,000 for their relief. Now their home is made with new zinc roof and happily settled.

8: A single mother with 3 daughters had their house and property destroyed by Lighting. Our team from Bastipur rushed to the village and helped the women and handed over Rs. 10,000. A girl of 22 years died due to the lighting and we handed Rs. 10,000 to the bereaved mother.

9; In Kathmandu we handed Rs. 5000 to the mother of a six years old daughter in hospital. We initiated the fund- raising by donating Rs. 17,000 for the Kidney operation of a poor man Rabindra Thami. The fund collected is now Rs. 500,000.

10: An important FLOUR GRINDING MACHINE was needed for the villagers of far west Nepal and SKY initiated the fund raising by donating Rs. 30,000 and our generous partner ASMAN donated Rs. 35,000 which made it possible to have the machine fitted. It has now helped save time and difficulties to the village women who had to walk for 4 hours to have their food grains work.

11: The Goth Danda Primary School had the new zinc roof and walls repaired by the fund of Rs. 210,000 donated by the NAMASTE CLUB OF JAPAN. Mr. Hiroshi Ishikawa initiated the repair of the ANJU MARGA road damaged by the flood and landslides with Rs. 70,000.

12: Friends of SKY from Japan- Mrs. Sylvie Okamoto and the organization Mohaninokai Nepal distributed blankets and foods to the 35 girls of the EPSA Nepal. This organization is now closely working with us.

13: A popular clothing company SHERPA ADVENTURE GEARS has been working with SKY since 2016 for the distribution of warm clothes to the earthquake affected villagers and people with physical disability. This year they have donated warm blankets to an orphanage and the senior citizens of Bastipur.

14: Mrs. Purnima Lankford (Upadhaya) of US has been a great supporter of SKY by donating on a regular basis. The fund from her is for higher education of 3 girls of Shikharpur and for a young boy with disability. It will be continued for 2 more years.

15: With the support of SKY friends, A community home and water projects for 2 villages of 60 families in Gorkha have been constructed and handed over to them.

16: The health clinic building at the Gorkha village of Kamaltar has been constructed and is in the final stage of having the health center in operation.

17: The 3rd building for the EPSA Nepal is under construction which will be completed in 3 months time and the Girls will be settled in their own Home. It is one of the best achievements of SKY's involvement in the field of physical disability and empowerment.

18: The SLOVAK CONSULATE have joined with SKY and we are already working with an organization known as the ULTIMUV of SLOVAKIA for the construction of 2 rooms new school and renovation of another schools. They are also helping an agriculture irrigation project in Saitar village.

19: The donor of 2 homes for EPSA Nepal, Ms. ADVENTURE 6000 have also provided us fund for the renovation of 4 school buildings in and around Bastipur.

20: A good news for SKY is the Invitation to visit Austria – Vienna for the prestigious ZERO PROJECT CONFERENCE 2018 being held at United Nations office/ Vienna International Center, Austria. I have already applied for the SCHENGEN VISA. This opportunity was possible by the recommendation of Ms.

Sangita Pant -EPSA Nepal(Award Winner of 2017 ZERO PROJECT). I will be making a presentation of photos of SKY work and short speech on the Humanitarian Aid and disability.

In the coming year 2018, SKY will be more involved in the Makawanpur district for the construction and renovation of schools building. We will also seek more donors and working partners to help the disadvantaged and underprivileged ones in other parts of Nepal.

As always all these are possible with your kind support, help and encouragement. We will now try to take the work of SKY to another level with the inclusions of our daughters and younger generation of staff.
